

Weekly Reflections by Joseph Zenk, Pastoral Leader

This weekend, we celebrate the feast day of St. Blaise. Technically, his feast is February 3 and, because the Sunday readings override the feast, we don't hear too much about him. But as is our custom at our three parishes, we will still invite anyone who wishes to have their throat blessed do so at the end of each of our Masses this weekend.

So what is the story with Blaise? Why bless throats in his memory?

The truth is, we know little about the life of St. Blaise. He lived in the third and fourth centuries and was bishop of Sebastia, Armenia. According to legend, he was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Milan (granting freedom of worship) had been written three years earlier, there was still persecution in Armenia, forcing Blaise to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer

Legend has it that after a group of hunters stumbled upon him, they took him captive and began to haul him off to prison. While this was happening, a mother came up to Blaise with her son, who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the fish bone.

Once in prison, the governor tried to

get Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. When he refused, he was beaten and ultimately martyred for his faith around the year 316 A.D. The use of candles in the blessing has traditionally recalled the candles Blaise used to burn while imprisoned. In days gone by, the blessing would take place with lit candles and one would place their neck between them. Due to the onset of flammable hair spray and insurance companies, it was thought better of continuing that practice and today, we bless with unlit candles.

So why continue? We don't have fish bones lodged in our throats. What need do our throats have of blessing? Aside from those viruses and colds, which often find their way into our throats, the throat is necessary for speech. And speech has the power to unite or divide, to build up or to tear down. Within this blessing, we ask God to deliver us from every disease of the throat...be that a cough, a soreness or a habit of using speech that divides. May God, through the intercession of St. Blaise, heal and use our throats for the building up of the Kingdom.

Prayer for the Week: Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
